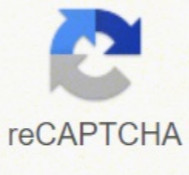

Unemployment usually leads adult students to college, but this recession may be different. The coronavirus has created questions about the prospects of work after graduation. There are many pros and cons for non-traditional students returning to school. The massive loss of employment has pushed many American workers to follow higher education in the past. But with all the uncertainty caused by the COVID-19 crisis, is it now the right time to go back to school? The big recession of 2008 caused an increase in university enrolment. Between 2007-2010, the number of university students increased by almost 2.5 million, according to the hechinger report. Most of them were non-traditional students—also known as adult students—over 25 years of age.
